1. Call to Order:

3. <u>5:35 Preliminary Engineering Plan Public Hearing</u>: Tea Commerce Addition Preliminary

Development Plan

Legal Description: Tract 1 of Ronald Mueller Addition to the City of Tea, Lincoln County, South

Dakota

Zoning: Rural Service District/AG

The Board held a public meeting to review a development plan for 60+ acres of Tract 1, Ronald Mueller Addition. The Tea Commerce Addition is divided into two phases based on available sewer. The land-use plan indicates General Commercial, Light Industrial and Residential uses. The Tea Future Land-use Plan shows Regional Commercial and Business Park uses. The recommendation is to zone the designated commercial and residential tracts to Mixed Use Commercial.

Phase 1 utilities will come off Gateway Boulevard. Thomas Avenue is extended south acting as the main access into the development off Gateway Boulevard. There are multiple accesses points planned off 470th Street including Commerce Street and two extensions from neighboring subdivisions. The Board discussed renaming 470th Avenue. Also, there was some discussion on Commerce Street alignment onto 470th.

The R2 tracts (6.47 acres) will require an open space dedication cash in lieu or plan for additional open space on the next tract. The open space dedication is required to be usable space and not detention sites. A note was added to the preliminary plan. Final dedication is reflected in the Developers Agreement.

Drainage is contained onsite through a series of small detention sites.

Ben Scholtz, HDR Engineering presented his review comments and recommended approval.

Motion by Venard, Seconded by Magg to recommend approval to the city council for the preliminary plans for the Tea Commerce Preliminary Development Plan. All members voted AYE.
